
This suggestion has come from our parent community and we agree that a day to reset and recharge might be valuable in making the last few weeks as positive as they can be.

- or whatever else you can think of!



The students' work for the day will be to somehow capture the activity. This could be writing about your activity, filming it or just snapping a photo. We would love to see or at least hear about how you spent your day!
