### Lunch Orders




Despite a few hiccups, the students have had a wonderful time with Judy, particularly enjoying breakfast and afternoon tea.

Judy aims to develop a program that is child-centred and will be seeking the children's input on the types of activities they would like to be doing before and after school.

***\*Please remember that as per Department Guidelines, students will not be supervised by Heskett Primary School staff until 8.45am each morning and not after 3.45pm. Students arriving before 8.45am are expected to be booked into before school care.***

### **Library – a note from Mrs Russell**

- This term we will be learning how the library works and the obligations of borrowers and using the library. We concentrate on books by Australian authors. Students will complete a range of activities including responding to texts through making connections to the world, other text and themselves. They will create artefacts through writing, discussion and art.
- Students are encouraged to choose a 'good fit' book, although sometimes they might like to borrow a book that is not at their level but something that they are really interested in. This is a great opportunity to develop their love of books even if they are only looking at the pictures. Also, it's important to have conversations about what they have read/seen.
- Please be aware that any students with outstanding overdue books will be unable to borrow until they either return the books or pay for the missing books. This will enable me to replace the book so other students can also borrow them.



### **CSEF - Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund**

#### **Eligibility**

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### **Criteria 1**

To be eligible\* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;

Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR

- Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- Submit an application to the school by the due date.

A special consideration eligibility category also exists.

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

**Criteria 2** - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive. For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

**Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either Term One (28 January 2020) or Term Two (14 April 2020).

If you believe you are eligible for the above, please request a form from Jeanette (Tuesday), complete and return by Wednesday 20th February.

Claimants from this school in 2019 do not have to complete new forms for this year.
